The Five-storied Pagoda (*Gōjū-no-tō*) of Taisekiji is one of the major buildings at the Head Temple. In December of 2016, the major renovation of the Pagoda was completed, restoring its beauty and magnificence.

This exhibition explains the history and transition of the Buddha-Stupas founded in India, the significance of the Buddha-Stupa revealed in the sutras, and the history of the Five-storied Pagoda of Head Temple Taisekiji since its establishment approximately 270 years ago.

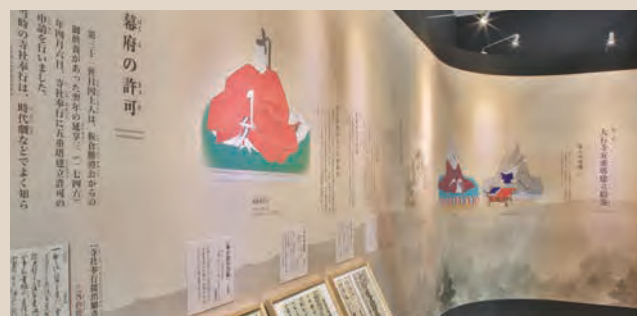
